HISTORY, FACTS AND ISSUES:

This request concerns a Petition to add 18 lots of Phase 3B of the Creekside West Subdivision into the County's basic decorative street lighting district under the Street Lighting Ordinance. For reference, staff has verified that the Petition is ready for LCBOC consideration, including verifying at least 2/3 of the owners' signatures for the proposed lot additions have been obtained, testing the financial solvency of the addition, and checking that associated lighting installation costs have been paid. Additionally, notice for the proposed district has been advertised in the VDT and signs have been posted to advertise the public hearing on the Petition. The current charges for the basic decorative street lighting district is \$61.50 per lot per year. Staff recommends adding this portion of Creekside West into the County's basic decorative street lighting district through approval of the attached amendment to the current Street Lighting Ordinance.

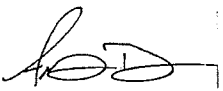
HISTORY, FACTS AND ISSUES: The majority of the public safety radios in the fire department inventory were purchased when the Public Safety Radio System was originally installed in 2002. Approximately two years ago Motorola served notice that as of December 2015 that the XTS portable models and XTL mobile models currently used by the fire department, and most other agencies in Lowndes County, were no longer being manufactured or supported. This means that in the coming years it will become increasingly harder to find parts to repair the units whenever they experience issues. During each of the last two fiscal years, Lowndes County has been systematically replacing the current radio cache. For fiscal year 2019, Lowndes County Fire Rescue has budgeted to replace all of the remaining portable and mobile radios that are no longer being supported by Motorola. Staff requested an updated pricing proposal from the local radio shop, Mobile Communications, and has received discounted pricing to allow for the replacement of 52 portables and 18 mobile radios.

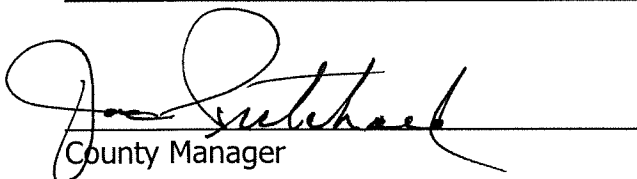

COUNTY ACTION REQUESTED ON: Request to Purchase Thermal Imaging Cameras

HISTORY, FACTS AND ISSUES: Thermal Imaging Cameras (TIC) have several uses in firefighting applications making them a valuable tool for firefighters. These cameras allow firefighters to identify hidden pockets of fire that are often trapped in crawl spaces and other voids in the construction without having to unnecessarily create further damage. Additional uses for these types of cameras include hazardous materials response, law enforcement responses and missing persons searches.

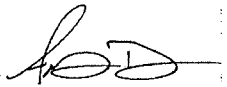
Last year Lowndes County was able to take advantage of a program offered by Bullard, the company that manufactures the cameras we currently use to upgrade to an improved model with enhanced features and capabilities at a discounted price. Through this trade in program we upgraded three Bullard Eclipse TICs to a brand-new Bullard Eclipse LDX which provided advanced features which have greatly enhanced our capabilities. This year we budgeted for 2 additional cameras to standardize our fleet with up to date equipment. Bullard currently has refurbished equipment program that will allow us to purchase two refurbished cameras exactly like the ones purchased last year at a savings of \$1,950 per camera over the cost of brand new units.

Extensions

HISTORY, FACTS AND ISSUES:

The Board has received the attached notice of annexation and rezoning which incorporates Hahira's making extraterritorial extensions of water and sewer services into the County's water and sewer service areas.

The subject property is approximately 36.75 acres depicted on the enclosed aerial photograph and Rezoning Map. It is the northern portion of the 64.32 acre parcel depicted on the Rezoning Map. It is on the north side of Hahira on the east side of Highway 41.

Section 2 of the Special Settlement Provisions of the Lowndes County Service Delivery Strategy Agreement effective July 1, 2008, provides "Any party may make an extraterritorial extension of water and sewer services upon approval of the affected party." It also provides "Such approval shall not be unreasonably withheld," considering the factors listed in the Agreement.

The attached notice evidences Hahira's intention to make extraterritorial extensions to provide water and sewer services to the subject property. The Annexation Petition and Rezoning Application signed by the property owner enclosed with the notice evidence the property owner's request for water and sewer services by Hahira.

The proposed extraterritorial extensions will not negatively affect property owners in the County's service areas or existing County water and sewer customers. The subject property is contiguous to Hahira's existing water and sewer service areas. The County has not made investments in infrastructure planning to serve the subject property or other properties in the immediate area and does not have plans to serve the subject property or other properties in the immediate area. The proposed extensions will not otherwise negatively affect the County's plans for the provision of water and sewer services to other properties in the County's service areas.

A proposed letter from Chairman Slaughter to Mayor Cain communicating the Board of Commissioners' approval of the proposed extraterritorial extensions is attached. It states the Board of Commissioners' approval is conditioned upon Hahira's annexation of the subject property and that if Hahira does not annex the subject property it will remain in the County's water and sewer service areas.

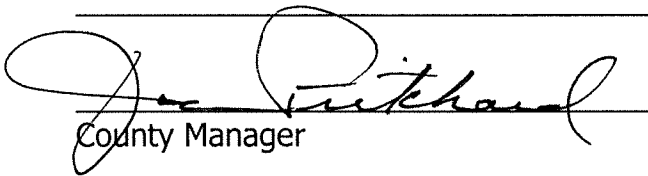
